Professor George Wajackoyah has an LLB (Hons) from the University of Wolverhampton (UK), CCL/LLM, School of Oriental & African Studies, University of London, LLM, University of Warwick (UK), LLM, University of Baltimore, and Advanced Diploma in French from the University of Burundi. Professor Wajackoyah has lectured extensively on Human and Workers' Rights in a global economy in the United Kingdom and the U.S. He was a guest speaker of Halala USA in Boston Massachusetts and recently in New Jersey, where he focused on economics, poverty and the plight of people in Western Kenya. The Honorable John F. Gossart, Jr., Judge, U.S. Immigration Court and Adjunct Professor at the UB School of Law, invited Professor Wajackoyah to speak on the 'Effect of the European Immigration law on the United Kingdom as compared to the U.S. Immigration laws and policy'. Professor Wajackoyah is currently an Adjunct Professor of law at American Heritage University and a Partner in Diagnostic Health Testing LLC., with sole distribution rights of EarlyDetect Inc. home testing kits in Africa.
